- AquaMates Program at Bold Park Aquatic (swimming and aquarobics for all abilities)



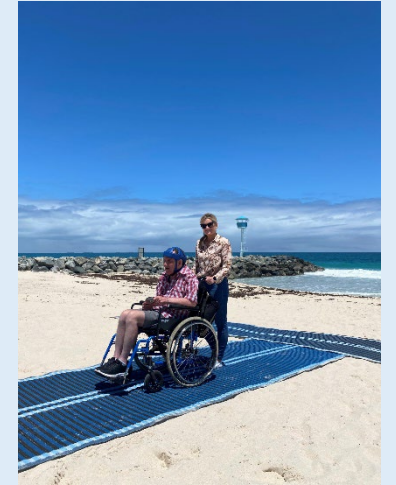

- Upgrade of West Leederville Memorial Gardens including, levelling of ground, widening of pathways, relocation of ACROD bays and an audio description installed in the gazebo
- Beecroft Park – DDA Compliant tables, seats and BBQ facilities
- New Accessible toilets at Rutter Park and Lake Monger
- Responses to request by a resident with a mobility impairment – resulted in the Infrastructure team working with the individual to modify the footpath and the intersection of Kimberley St and Lake Monger Drive for a successful outcome
- Bilingual Story Time – Cambridge Library
- Facilitating Opportunities for Clubs to attend Socially Inclusive Communities WA mentoring program
- The Town opened its new Seniors Hub



DAIP PROGRESS 2019/2020

- Weekly Auslan and lip reading workshops at Cambridge Library
- Inaugural baby sign story time
- Improved Beach Access at City Beach

- Revision of the Town's Style Guide to incorporate accessible guidelines

- Work experience opportunity for local youth with developmental disability at WGC.



- Upgrades of the Town's open spaces to encourage inclusive play:
 - Floreat Beach Playground – accessible artistic pathway, nest swing, jetty and water play and other sensory elements.
 - Rutter Park Playground – Accessible rubber path and nest swing.
 - Selby, Boulevard gardens – Path upgrades to improve connectivity and safety
 - Beecroft Park – UA toilet and accessible picnic tables
 - City Beach Walking Trail and Perry Lakes - Universal drink fountains
 - Keane Street, Wembley – addition of a new intergenerational play space featuring low impact nature base equipment.
