

WILDLIFE CARE INFORMATION SHEET

General Information: We do not always like or understand what occurs in nature but generally as a rule we should not interfere unless the animal is in imminent danger due to causes related to human interference. Please accept that sometimes the advice provided by the experts listed on this sheet might not be what you expected but trust it is in the best interests on the wildlife concerned.

BIRDS

Do They Need Help	Do not automatically assume they need your help. Often the parents are teaching the young ones how to survive. A good example is Magpies and if you look around you will often see the parents watching from a safe distance. Do Not Rescue birds unless you are sure they are in danger as you may be doing more harm than good.
What To Do	If the bird has been injured or is in imminent danger then call a specialist for advice. There are places that can care for these birds if necessary but they are often operated by volunteers and may need you to deliver the bird to them.

What To Do	Snakes / Lizards will generally stay away from people and usually only attack if you stray into their direct path... or step on them. Give them space and allow them to continue on their way. Snake Handlers will only relocate a snake if it is outside of their environment i.e inside a home, school, backyard Bobtails are generally harmless and should be left to find their own way.
